Library Corner

A Parent's Guide to Research and NoodleTools at ASMS

Dear Parents,

You may have noticed that your children are working on research-based projects in several classes. All three grades are currently engaged in research or will be beginning soon.

As we move into science and research project season, I'd like to highlight the research tools and support available to students at ASMS.

Sources and Research Resources

All information-literacy resources are available on our [Information Literacy](#) website. Students should have bookmarked this site but these materials can also be accessed through the Student Internet Resources section of the school website. Students have been introduced to this site and regularly use it at school.

This section includes links and passwords for the databases and online encyclopedias we subscribe to as a school, including:

- **Gale Database:** Widely used in educational institutions. Sixth graders are encouraged to use Middle School in Context for best results.
- **Encyclopedia Britannica:** An excellent starting point for general background research.
- **Infobase:** A collection of mostly nonfiction digital books.
- **Library Catalog:** Allows students to search the ASMS library collection for print and digital sources.

In addition, I often create project-specific resource sites for most research assignments. These links are typically linked on the [Information Literacy](#) website and posted in Google Classroom and within the appropriate class and often include additional recommended sources. Our goal is to help students move away from “Googling” and toward higher-quality, more reliable research tools.

NoodleTools

All students now have experience using NoodleTools, a platform that helps them organize, evaluate, and cite sources. This tool is used across all three grades and throughout the curriculum to reinforce research and citation skills.

For parents who would like support using NoodleTools with their students, instructional videos covering the basic functions can be found [HERE](#).

Students are guided to record one idea per digital note card, usually pulling a quote of about one sentence. The paraphrasing section is especially important, as it shows the student’s understanding of the information. The “My Ideas” section is used differently depending on the project and allows for some flexibility in how students organize their thinking.

Public Library Resources

ASMS maintains a school account with the public library and can request physical materials for student use. We also ask that all students have their own library card and know their password so they can access additional digital research resources independently.

If your family needs help obtaining a card or resetting a password, I’m happy to assist.

As always, I’m available to help students find and evaluate sources and to support both students and parents with NoodleTools.
