PRE-PRISM Volunteer Opportunities

(Work completed on your own time)

DONATION PROCUREMENT

Number of volunteers requested: 3–4

Dates: February 9 – March 25

Time commitment: Approximately 4–5 hours per person

Responsibilities:

- Work as a team to solicit donations from businesses (in person, by phone, or by email).
- A letter is scheduled to be sent out 2/4 to last year's participating businesses and can be provided for new vendors.
- A solicitation script can be provided if helpful when making the follow up phone call.
- Request and pick up donations between February 9 and March 25.
- Update the Master Spreadsheet at least weekly to keep all PRISM team members informed.
- Arrange pickup or drop-off of all donated items to the school.
- New donor ideas and contacts are welcomed and encouraged!

Ultimately, donations will be categorized as **Raffle Items**, **Silent Auction Items**, or **Live Auction Items**, including themed class/grade baskets.

CLASS OR GRADE BASKET PROCUREMENT

Number of volunteers requested: 1–2

Dates: February 9 – March 25

Time commitment: Approximately 4–5 hours per person

Responsibilities:

- Work as a team to identify and develop creative basket ideas for each class or grade.
 - Share basket ideas on the Master Spreadsheet [to avoid duplicate business solicitations].
 - Email parents regarding basket themes, reimbursement details, and contribution amounts (kept consistent per basket, e.g., \$10 per student).
 - A copy of last year's email can be provided.
 - Monitor donations as they come in and follow up as needed.
 - Baskets should be ideated and assembled between February 9 and March 25.

Number of volunteers requested: 1–2

Dates: March 25 – April 1

Responsibilities:

- Create labels for donated items and bidding sheets for auction items with accurate descriptions.
 - Reference prior-year materials to streamline the process.

Dates: March 9 – April 1

Responsibilities:

- Track raffle ticket sales prior to the event, including purchaser name, ticket numbers assigned, and quantity purchased.
 - Collate tickets into envelopes for event distribution.
 - Reconcile funds received and provide weekly updates to PRISM team members.

Volunteers needed: 4

Time: 2:30–4:30 PM

Responsibilities:

- Collect prepared donations, labels, bidding sheets, and supplies from the school lobby.

- Set up donations at pre-assigned tables in the lobby.
- A CMOG event manager will be available to assist with tables and supplies as needed.

RAFFLE MANAGEMENT

Responsibilities:

- Assist with raffle ticket sales at three tables:
 - Will Call (pre-purchased tickets)
 - Cash/Check

- During the show, help select raffle winners and record them in a pre-prepared Excel sheet.
- Volunteers will be rotated into the show as quickly as possible—if your child is performing, please go watch!
- Remove certificates and gifts from frames and place them into envelopes for winners.

Library Corner

Greetings Owls,

February is Black History Month. In the ASMS Library, we are using this time to recognize and celebrate the many achievements and contributions of Black and African Americans. Throughout the month, our focus will be on books by Black authors and stories that highlight Black experiences—historical and contemporary.

Black History Month has been recognized in the United States since 1926. It was established by Carter G. Woodson, often called “the father of Black history,” who envisioned a dedicated time to encourage the coordinated teaching of Black history in public schools (Franklin, 2022). February was chosen to coincide with the birthdays of Abraham Lincoln and Frederick Douglass, both of whom played significant roles in the fight against slavery.

In 2016, President Barack Obama remarked:

“Black History Month shouldn't be treated as though it is somehow separate from our collective American history... It's about the lived, shared experience of all African Americans, high and low, famous and obscure, and how those experiences have shaped and challenged and ultimately strengthened America.”

In the library, we will be featuring books by Black authors and books that center Black characters and stories. If you or your student would like to explore Black history further, the following resources are excellent places to start:
